We have lived in West Wrentham for 36 years. 70 Spring Street

One major attraction of West Wrentham **was and IS**, is the quiet, country feel of Sheldonville/West Wrentham.

Indeed, there are ZONING restrictions REQUIRING 2 ACRES per dwelling, I believe, generally throughout this area. That's for a reason. To preserve the country's tranquility there.

The proposed sites seem to me to be almost suitable to qualify as WETLANDS and trucking in tons and tons of *possibly polluted fill* sounds like a builders joke and a very bad/unacceptable idea. Builders should NOT be given allowance to damage our neighborhoods.
