**Minutes of the Presidential Primary Election**  
**March 3, 2020**

The polls were declared open at 7:00 a.m. by Warden Mary Geromini. There were approximately 25 voters standing in the lobby of the school to cast their ballots. Sample Ballots, Instructions to Voters, Voters Bill of Rights, and Zero Tabulations from Precinct 1, Precinct 2 and Precinct 3 were posted. The AutoMark handicap voting machine was turned on.

Town Clerk, Cynthia Thompson welcomed the Election Inspectors for the first of four upcoming elections in 2020. This year's primary welcomed three new Election Workers to our group (Patricia Sluss, Marguerite Pennini, and Marsha Bogdanchik). Wrentham is very lucky to have such dedicated individuals to help the voting process run so smoothly. The Clerk reviewed the ballot procedures for the upcoming day, including the Check In/Check Out book notations, as this was a Primary Election. All workers were sworn in and oaths were signed.

Reminders were given to the election inspectors that individuals enrolled in a party must take that particular ballot. Unenrolled voters and members of political designations may choose which ballot to receive.

This was the first election using the new ImageCast Tabulators (with accompanying new ballot boxes) recently purchased from LHS Associates in New Hampshire. LHS provided the Town with a representative (Cindy Gill) that helped to ensure that the machines were in proper operation along with any additional training needed. Nine voting booths were used (3 in each precinct), six of which were also brand new purchased from Inclusion Solutions. There were a couple of ballot jams that were cleared quickly and easily. Two of the precincts had separate issues with a reboot of the tabulator when ballots were inserted/pulled out quickly by the voter. This particular situation should disappear once the voters get acquainted with the new equipment.

Special thanks to Department of Public Works, the Elementary School custodians and the Wrentham Police Department who helped with the setup and take down of the equipment.

The ballot boxes were opened and inspected by Deputy Warden William Jones and Town Clerk, Cynthia Thompson. The boxes proved to be empty and the zero tabulation was run and posted.

Turnout was quite steady with 459 voters having cast their ballots by 9:00 a.m. At the time of the Presidential Primary, there were 8,740 registered voters in Wrentham.

A total of 501 voters chose to Early Vote throughout the week of February 24<sup>th</sup> through February 28<sup>th</sup>. This was the first time Early Voting was held during a Presidential Primary. All Early Voting Ballots and 57 Absentee Ballots were processed by the Precinct Clerks throughout the day.

One voter used the Automark voting machine.

At 8:00 p.m. Warden Geromini closed the polls. There were no voters waiting in line. The voting machines were programmed for tabulation and two sets of tapes were run. Tellers worked on reconciling their books and write-in votes were recorded. Un-Official results were e-mailed to parties that requested them by 10:15 p.m.

There were three provisional ballots, one of which turned out to be an RMV Inquiry and the other two voters were previously registered in Foxboro before moving to Rhode Island. There were several residents who filled out Affirmations. At 8:00 p.m. a total of 3252 voters cast their ballots, or 37%.

All materials were returned to Town Hall by 10:30 p.m. The Town Clerk would like to thank everyone who worked at this election to help make all run effortlessly without any issues. A special thanks to the Assistant Town Clerk, Ellen Wojcik who is always reliable and a great asset for my department.
