The Vision Behind the Monument

Ever since he was a child, Eagle Scout candidate Jackson Frye would spend hours at home in front of the fireplace, creating and recreating battles with lead soldiers from every era. When he wasn't doing that, he spent hours in front of the television eagerly soaking up facts from the History Channel. His bookshelves were filled to the brim with books on any war or significant historical figure you could imagine. While his interests and hobbies evolved throughout the years, his love for history, especially US history, never diminished. So when it came time to choose his Eagle Scout Project in 2022, the stars aligned; he wanted a large and impactful project that he could be passionate about, and it just so happened that Wrentham was lacking a Revolutionary War Memorial. The town welcomed his vision with open arms as it approached its 350th anniversary and celebration of its incorporation.

The Building of the Monument

The granite used as the main stone for the monument was discovered just a few years ago on the side of the road near Wampum Corner. Greg Stahl, a local contractor who is also the former chairman of the town's historical commission, was working on a job and spotted the large piece of stone in the bushes. Stahl believes the granite was part of a railroad bridge that once crossed West Street just past Wampum Corner. The bridge was part of the Old Colony Railroad, which operated from 1845 to 1893. The railroad then became the New York, New Haven, and Hartford line, which ceased operations in 1959. The bridge was most likely dismantled in the 1980s, surmised Stahl, with several pieces of granite discarded on site.

Stahl also believes the granite used in the bridge was quarried in a nearby area known as Wampum Rock, the last known site where Indians lived in Wrentham. The Historical Commission took possession of the granite block, with the purpose of using it for a Commission-sponsored monument in the future. When the group became aware of Frye's Eagle Scout project, it became clear where the piece of granite belonged. This allowed Jackson to build his monument with stone that had a strong connection to local history.

With his vision in mind and stone in hand, Jackson worked with King Philip Regional High School art student Madison Schoener to render drawings of his vision and local monument makers, veteran Todd and Shila Duffy, owners of Tribute In Stone, to fabricate the design.

The words on the bronze plaque are Frye's own, and the Eagle atop the monument was created by Idaho veteran, Mike Curtis, who is well known for creating beautiful and inspiring wildlife sculptures in bronze. Mike's sculptures have been presented both to and by United States Presidents. The Story Behind the SAR Insignia

The SAR insignia consists of a [Maltese cross](#) surrounded by a garland, with a relief of [George Washington](#) in a center circle.

The Maltese cross used in the SAR Badge draws its inspiration from the cross used by the [Order of St. Louis](#) of France. The wreath symbolizes the laurel wreaths presented to worthy individuals by the Roman Republic. Major West selected the Cross of St. Louis as his basis for the decoration because [King Louis XVI](#) of France, the Grand Master of the Order of St. Louis, provided badly needed aid to the fledgling Continentals. In choosing this cross, the National Society intended to recognize the French contribution to American independence.

The eight points of the Maltese Cross represent the eight Beatitudes prescribed in the Sermon on the Mount: blessed are (1) the poor in spirit, (2) the meek, (3) the pure, (4) the merciful, and (5) the peacemakers, (6) blessed are they that mourn, and (7) seek righteousness, and (8) blessed are they who are persecuted for righteousness sake.

Surrounding the relief of Washington in the center are the words "LIBERTAS ET PATRIA", a reminder of the [United States Declaration of Independence](#) and the [United States Constitution](#).^[7]

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
